Rich Strazinski, has seen no improvement since 1991. Objects to the SAD. Suggest bringing in the DEQ and DNR to help solve it.

Chuck, the DEQ and DNR will not financially support weed control in any inland lake. Still supports weevils, but the weevils can't keep up with the Asian Milfoil. Weevils won't eat the Starry Stonewort.
