# PUBLIC ACT 188 OF 1954 PROCEEDINGS Paw Paw Township Van Buren County, Michigan

#### PREAMBLE AND RESOLUTION

Special Assessment Roll for Special Assessment District No. 2022-1

WHEREAS, the township board of the Township of Paw Paw, Van Buren County, Michigan, after due and legal notice, has conducted a public hearing upon a proposed assessment roll prepared by the supervisor and assessing officer of the township for the purpose of defraying the cost of maintenance proposed to be conducted within the Special Assessment District No. 2022-1.

AND WHEREAS, such public hearing was preceded by proper notice in the Courier-Leader, a newspaper of general circulation in the township, and by first-class mail to each property owner of record within said district and upon said assessment roll;

AND WHEREAS, comments were received from those present at such public hearing concerning said assessment roll and opportunity to all present to be heard in the matter;

AND WHEREAS, no written objections were received to said roll and levy;

AND WHEREAS, a record of those present to protest, and of written protests submitted at or before the public hearing was made a part of the minutes of the hearing;

AND WHEREAS, the township board has duly inspected the proposed assessment roll and considered all comments and proposed amendments thereto and has found the proposed assessment roll, as amended, to be correct, just and reasonable;

# NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- The assessment roll submitted by the supervisor and assessing officer of the township (as amended in the within resolution) shall hereafter be designated as Lake Cora Weed Control Special Assessment District No. 2022-1 and shall hereby be confirmed as the assessment roll for Special Assessment District No. 2022-1.
- 2. Said Special Assessment Roll in the total sum of \$60,000. plus, expenses, legal, 1% administration fee, publication and initial billing costs and said Special Assessment Roll is described as all parcels of land, determined the be 118 parcels, to be assessed with the name of the respective owners thereof, if known, and shows a total to be assessed against each parcel of land in the Special Assessment District as the benefit of the parcel of land bears to the total benefit of all parcels benefited in said District is \$173.26 per parcel, subject to modification in accordance to law, for 3 years commencing 2025 through 2027. All unpaid installments prior to the transfer of the tax roll shall bear interest as provided by Public Act 188 of 1954 payable annually on each installment due at the rate of 5% percent per annum commencing on the first installment due date hereinbefore set forth. Any payment made before such first installment shall not bear any such interest.
- 3. Future installments of an assessment against a parcel may be paid to the Township Treasurer any time in full with interest accrued through the month in which the final installment is paid in accordance with Public Act 188 of 1954 as amended. If any installment of a Special Assessment is not paid when due, then the installment shall be considered to be delinquent and there shall be collected, in addition to the interest provided by this section, a penalty rate of 1% for each month, or fraction of a month, that the installment remains unpaid before being reported to the Township Board for reassessment upon the Township Tax Roll, also in accordance with Public Act 188 of 1954.
- 4. The assessments made in said special assessment roll are hereby ordered and directed to be collected by the Township Treasurer, and the Township Clerk shall deliver said special assessment roll to said Treasurer with his warrant attached, commanding the Treasurer to collect such assessment in accordance with the direction of the Township Board and said Public Act 188 of 1954.
- 5. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same are hereby rescinded.
