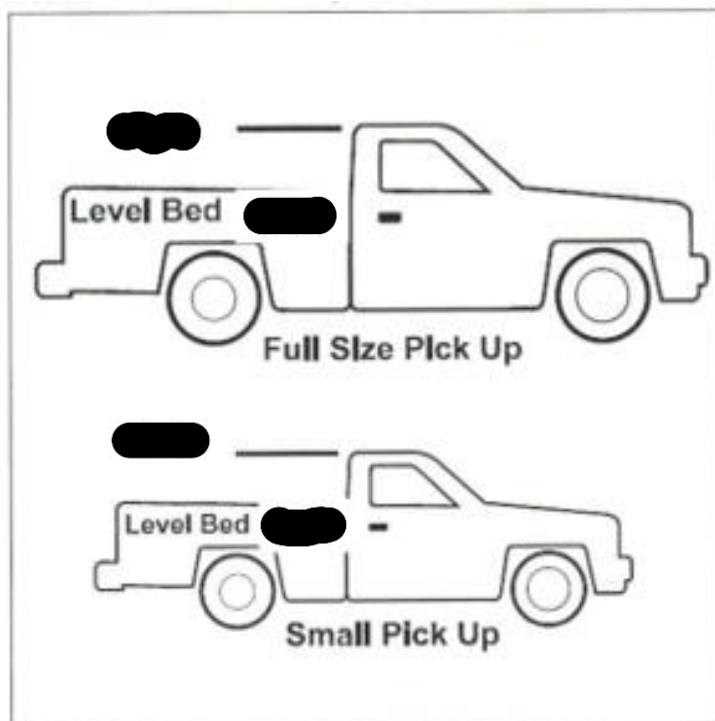

Different size trucks and trailers (at the discretion of the station operators) will add or subtract a load price according to over-fill of truck or trailer.

Recycling free to Paw Paw Township residents with an up to date Recycle Pass

Recycling fee without Recycle Pass: \$ 6.00 per 18 gallon tote

Non-resident yearly Recycle Pass \$75.00

NO PLASTIC BAGS or TRASH ALLOWED

All material must be clean and free of food, liquid, or original contents. Empty out all plastic bags of recycling material.

Acceptable Recycling Materials

Paper Products:

Newspaper, including inserts
Food Boxes
Paper Boxes
Magazines
Catalogs
Copy Paper
Corrugated or Regular Cardboard Flattened
Junk Mail
Phone Books

Glass:

Clear, Green, and Brown Jars & Bottles

Plastic:

Ridged plastic containers with #1-#7 recycling symbol

NEW!!- Styrofoam (must be bagged)

\$3.00 per 1 cubic yard bag, available at the transfer station.

Metal:

Food Cans, Foil, Pie Tins, Lids

Tires:

Passenger Vehicles, cars and trucks (Residents=4 tires per day, Non-residents=4 tires per day @ \$5.00 per tire)
